Review of last month's meeting minutes and agenda sent out for today's meeting. 2.) <u>Northwood Coalition Training</u>-Lynn Feldman and Sue Hampton attended. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.) Last meeting was October 28, 2013. 2.) Lynn Feldman and Sue Hampton reported on the training. They stated that the Drug Recognition Educators (DRE) from the Wausau Police Department presented the training. Lynn stated that the training went over visual signs and general indicators of different drugs, i.e. pupil size, body temp., & behavior. Some hands on. Sue thought the training was especially useful for schools. Talked about new drugs. Assessment form to tell if someone was under the influence was shared. Dawn Klink asked about HIPPA. Lynn and Sue stated that they also talked about the laws and that they can't go to court with what you have. Students can refuse assessment. Meant to be a guide for referrals. Not meant to be submisable in court. Stated that it was road sobriety test type training. It helped defining behaviors. Stated that many community partners were in attendance, i.e. 2 counselors from RHS, human service center employees, tri-county council employees were all in attendance.

It was also agreed upon that each coalition would send a person to the substance abuse certification training which each coalition will need. Coalition members suggested Tony Albright and Jim St. Charles might have names of people willing to tell their story. The panel will be from 10:15-11:30. Char offered a copy of Doug Nelson' Video "<i>Breaking the Stigma</i>" and was informed that the AODA had viewed the video at a prior meeting. Stated that they are looking for someone on AODA to branch off to other schools other than Rhinelander High School. Char also reported that the survey they did was done for the purpose of data collection. Char stated that sponsorship by Northern Area Highland is giving prizes for the videos and they will be judged and the prizes awarded. NAMI does a video contest as well which is statewide. Lynn Feldman stated that this would fall under her job at UW Extension. Karen Knutson asked if guidelines were established for the \$500 prize money.
