<u>Agency Updates:</u>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kirsten Margitan reported that they now have a Drug drop off box located at the police station. She has kids doing posters to advertise the drop box. • Jim St. Charles reported an increase in participation at Koinonia groups since Options took over. Jim is trying to get a halfway house property available on the Koinonia grounds for it. He stated that participants in the program do better when they go to jail first then Koinonia rather than when they go to Koinonia first, then jail. • Kyle Parish from the Rhinelander Police Department is planning to contact Art Start for Marijuana talk. Has a talk scheduled Nov. 18th at 8:30 and 10:30 for middle and high school kids in the Auditorium, they are inviting parents. • Cooper Henckel reported that the Human Service Grant assisted in getting a drop box in Three Lakes. Rhinelander, Three Lakes, and Minocqua are using 2nd step prevention program for K-5. He is working with MHLT to get elementary through middle school. Climb Theater will be doing a brief skit on prevention at the elementary school in Three Lakes, the High School in Rhinelander is tentative and after discussion with other AODA Coalition members Cooper decided that Climb Theater is geared to a younger audience. Cooper has 9,000 brochures available for AODA coalition members to take and distribute.

Anne Cirilli, Dawn Klink, and Sue Kirby attended. Anne and Dawn reported on the summit. Empowerment Evaluation: A tool for Program Improvement and Sustainability was presented by Dr. David Fetterman. The 3 steps to Empowerment Evaluation include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mission • Taking Stock (of the way we are today) <p>List all of the activities your coalition is interested in doing and give each of the members a certain number of dots to put by the activities they are most interested in pursuing. Rate the activities and have a dialogue/select.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Planning for the Future (goals, strategies, evidence). <p><i>Parents Who Host</i> information from the summit was shared with Coalition members today.</p> <p>7.) Katie reported on the conference and that a lot of states are taking the “In Your Face” approach and putting up billboards, signs, advertisements, posting statistics. Marathon County reportedly has adopted the approach. It was suggested that we look into the Digital Billboard on the corner of Davenport and Courtney. There is also a digital billboard on the corner of highway 47 and highway 8. Katie will check to find out who owns the billboards.</p>
