Anne C. reviewed the workplan as updated with 7 of the 20 strategies completed so far this year. 4 strategies were targeted for 2016 and will be removed from the workplan, such as the AODA Summit for 2016. Many “on-going” strategies will be completed this fall. |

Cooper announced that there is still a large amount of money from the Human Services Grant available to the AODA Coalition to be spent by December 30th, 2015. Some of this grant is ear-marked for the school system. They have arranged for an acting group, “Climb Together” from MN to perform “little plays” on drug abuse to encourage good choices. They can come in for two days if another school would like to tap into this talented group of performs, contact Cooper Henckel.</p> <p>2.) Lakeland Area Task Force received a very large sum of money to deal with opioid issues. No update from Bob Kovar. See his notes from <i>NEWS YOU SHOULD KNOW</i>.</p> <p>3.) Lynn Feldman is also trying to contact the <i>KNOW!</i> project to get the approval to use their logo.</p> <p>4.) Linda Rozga and Katie Kennedy have been trying to find a time to meet with the AODA support staff to begin discussion on how the future combined coalition will work. They hope to develop the workplan so there are sub-committees working on all identified issues, (UAD, RX drug abuse, suicide prevention, etc.) Should we be looking at funding a LTE for a facilitator’s assistance on this project? Lynn Feldman offered her facilitator’s role if needed. Cooper Henckel offered to organize data for outcome. We will need a new name; new By-laws and will create the subgroups for 2016.</p> <p>5.) Dawn K and Anne C. will meet with Sara Jesse next week to discuss the progress of the CHIA grant and review our work plan. The first CHIA summit: “<i>Setting and Agenda for Collective Impact</i>”, will be held on Oct. 23rd in Stevens Point. There are still openings for anyone who wants to ride down with the Health Department staff.</p> <p>6.) Tony attended the <i>Prime For Life: “Talking with your Kids about Alcohol”</i> conference this summer. They have DVD materials which we can purchase. The critical take home message was: “Biology + Choice = Risks (outcomes)” and discussed the phases of addictions. This was a research evidence based program.
