Review of last month's minutes</p> <p>2.) <i>FRC Home Visitor's Summit</i> at Nicolet College on March 22<sup>nd</sup>.</p> <p>3.) 2013 AODA budget update:</p>	<p>Anne C. got a call from Megan Schrieber at the Brown Co. <b>211 Call Center</b> requesting an update on the AODA Coalition. Added OCHD website with info on the past minutes and agendas.</p> <p>1.) no changes or comments</p> <p>2.) Sara Gardner attended the <i>Family Resource Connection Home Visitor's Summit</i> and provided excellent information for visitors to beware of households that may be involved in the drug trade. Other people who may benefit from this information would be landlords, appraisers, or anyone else who may have access to people private living quarters. Follow-up trainings are a possibility. Law Enforcement is not bound to HIPAA, therefore they can create a "Most Wanted" list for the public.</p> <p>3.) 2013 AODA budget was reviewed. We have \$1,164.62.</p>

Materials have not arrived yet. Anne C. does have posters from last year available to anyone who wants to start putting them up. Jim St. C. said the Koinonia Alumni would be interested in getting some posters. “<i>Kids In Need</i>” group may also be contacted to distribute yard signs.</p> <p>2.) The Northwoods Coalition had a telephone conference call on March 4<sup>th</sup>. They are looking at the <i>Alliance for Wisconsin Youth Grant</i> and members of our AODA Coalition, Karen Knudsen and Kelly Schoen attended the March 20<sup>th</sup> meeting to review the grant application process. Priority issues were identified as <i>Underage Drinking</i> and <i>Prescription Drug Abuse</i>. Possible strategies were brainstormed to address these issues. Each coalition in the region will have an opportunity to participate in the final prevention plan. The Regional Sub-Abuse Prevention plan has approx. \$15,000.00 available per grant. Strategies have been reviewed to include drug recognition training for law enforcement. The target population is for 12-25 year old age range. The next Northwood NRC meeting will be held on May 16<sup>th</sup> from 10 am - 2pm at the Antigo Public library.</p> <p>3.) The next RX Drug Task Force meeting is April 15<sup>th</sup> in Minocqua. Andrea Majermane from Madison is expected to speak at this meeting. The Task Force Leadership Team, which included Judge Nielson, recently returned from a retreat in Arizona. They are in the <i>6 month start up</i> &amp; will be in charge of distributing funds for the Rx Task Force. Rob Deede was here to give an update on the <b>Oneida County Mental Health Coalition</b>. They are not planning a Mental Health Summit this year, but hope to do this every other year. The next conference will be titled, “The 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Frank B. Kohler Summit”. On Friday, April 19<sup>th</sup> they are conducting a “train-the-trainer” on <b>QPR</b> (Question, Persuade &amp; Respond) for Suicide prevention. 19 people have signed up for this day long event. They are also developing a DVD on anti-bullying called “Open Door, Open Mind” and are conducting a High school student survey on anti-stigma. At the next Mental Health Coalition meeting on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, Missy Zoepfel will be talking about “EMIS” project (Eliminating Mental Illness Stigma) in the Public Health conference room from 11:30- 1:00pm.</p>

Bi-Annual Budget does include Mental Health with \$3.7 million in state funding for the newly formed office and the CST (Coordinated Services Team) to collaborate to close gaps in children's health. Rob is hoping that the AODA coalition will coordinate on resources with the Mental Health.</p> <p>5.) Those present reviewed and signed the AODA By-Laws with changes in red ink.</p> <p>6.) Susan Holster sent an email message that the next CHAMPS dinner is postponed to Fall 2013 because of budget restraints. We responded with a message asking how much money is needed to hold this event. We still have <i>community supper</i> money in our 2013 budget.</p>

OTHER: Post prom party</p>	<p>1.) Dawn V.D.H. and Anne C. will write an <i>ALCOHOL AWARENESS BLOG</i> for the OCHD website and share it with UW-Extension. It will include the <i>UW Population Health</i> report on the estimated cost of the burden of <i>Excessive Alcohol Use in WI</i> last year was \$6.8 billion.</p> <p>2.) Tamara Feest is waiting for the details of the <i>Substance Abuse Prevention</i> grant that they have been chosen to be the recipient. She has talked to Chief Steffes about including Law Enforcement in this grant.</p> <p>3.) It was suggested to contact Sheriff Jake Simpkins to coordinate the DES national drop off with the local police department. Their application form is easy to complete and will pay for the disposal of Rx drugs collected prior to the April 27<sup>th</sup> drop off date. Three Lakes and Minocqua are planning to participate in the national Drop Off event.</p> <p>4.) Bob encouraged us to write letters to parents again this year reminding them of the consequences of allowing minors to drink alcohol at prom and graduation parties. The Health Dept. received a request by the RHS Post-prom committee for donations. It was suggested they receive the \$50.00 worth of ITUNE cards that were not used last year. Anne C. will contact Donna D. with this information.</p>
