Agency Updates	<p>DHS (Dept. Health Services) -WI Budget Repair Bill signed, changes to Economic Support (Foodshare, Medicaid, etc.programs). Reformatting income maintenance.</p> <p>Mental Health Integrative Systems of Care- quarterly trainings, Human Service Center, Options Treatment Program and tribes.</p> <p>Koller Behavioral Health – New therapist for children and families, Jill Blank. Also a new psychiatrist on-board.</p> <p>Marshfield Clinic Minocqua Ctr – Kelly reports having a baby boy- CONGRATULATIONS ! ☺. She also reports a neuropsychologist, Dr. Matthew Powell, will be starting July 17th. He comes from the Milwaukee area (originally from Wausau). Will take adolescent to adult to start, but will accept children on a limited basis. Press release forthcoming.</p> <p>Birth to 3 – Coaching B-3 program, new way to practice. Training childcare providers in social-emotional development.</p> <p>Family Resource Connection – Wrote and received a Federal and State supported Home Visiting Grant- 5 year cycle. Available for Oneida, Forest and Langlade County residents. Will connect with pregnant women until ready to transition to other programs, if needed. Coordinating with Pre-natal Care Coordinators (PNCC) through Womens, Infants, Children (WIC) Program at Oneida County Health Dept., also.</p> <p>Writing for Children’s Trust Fund- Community Response: Langlade, Oneida, & Vilas – home visiting if needed with parent education. Draft letters of support and electronic submission is okay. Families will be screened through social services. Call to DSS—family accessed-may be at point where there’s not enough concern to open case. However if research into proves that there’s enough for referral, will provide access/resources. No legal grounds, in these cases. (Deb: if you find that I have this submitted incorrectly, please let me know asap. Thanks, Char)</p> <p>DSS (Dept. Social Services) - Have filled final vacancy, many new employees. There are big changes coming the first of the year. Please note that Medicaid transportation is no longer available, and has been privatized. Private entity:</p>	

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	<p>Logisticare. Term for clients to use is “hardship”. They may or may not be reimbursed for transportation costs.</p> <p>Headstart/Early Headstart- The new director for these programs is Carol Jackomino. Reporting cuts in federal and state funding. Just finished government review of programs, and the report was that there were “no non-compliances”! Teacher and child interactions were graded to be “well above the national average”. Carol reports that she has been asked to advise on other programs, due to the positive results of the government review. Currently have two existing collaborations: to Birth to 3 and Family Resource Connection. Note: <u>Looking for partnering and expanding resources for families of children birth to 3 y/o! Contact Carol.</u></p> <p>Impact Counseling – Re: Logisticare. Client can ask for provider they had in past. They do not have everything worked out. Changes in transportation, they need a different form. If clients have a repetitive appointment schedule, their provider could call to set-up a standing order for them.</p> <p>Human Service Center (HSC)– All positions have been filled. More adults interested in Coordinated Community Services (CCS-wraparound care program), and have been educating them about CCS. Number of children enrolled will increase next few months.</p>	
Family enrollment status	<p>Family Partners- 1 family on hold, 1 for state Oneida Co-2 families HSC- CCS : 6 adults and 12 children. Tri-Co Women- 46 women with teams and 17 females waiting. Includes Forest, Vilas, Oneida Co. Funding ends 12/31/11- up for competitive Urban Rural Female Treatment Projects. No RFP yet- may come out 9/2011. Birth to 3 – 1 family with wraparound.</p>
