Welcome and Introductions		
Agency Updates	<p><b>Tri-County Women’s Outreach</b> (<i>Dottie/Becky</i>): Dottie discussed funding. State requires them to apply for funding. Due date is Nov 18<sup>th</sup>. Will be notified Dec 13<sup>th</sup>. If they don’t receive funding, they will be done Jan 31<sup>st</sup>. Becky discussed vacancy with mobile crisis team. Terri Price-Decker will not be with Crisis Team after January 1<sup>st</sup>. There are two agencies expressing interest. Deadline is Nov. 18<sup>th</sup> and a decision will be made the following week. The selected agency will be notified Nov 23<sup>rd</sup>.</p> <p><b>Marshfield Clinic Counseling Center, Minocqua</b> (<i>Carole Meade</i>): They have a new neuropsychologist on staff.</p> <p><b>Headstart Program</b> (<i>Carol Jackomino</i>): The 2012 budget was increased for Headstart. The Senate approved with a bigger increase and the House approved with an even bigger increase. It is up to the “Super Committee” to make the final decision. The Headstart program is currently full with a waiting list.</p> <p><b>Social Services</b> (<i>Mary</i>): Social Services is finally fully staffed with social workers. They will, however, be losing a social worker and a supervisor position in 2012. <b>Reminder to All: Specific training dollars are available.</b></p> <p><b>Rhineland School District</b> (<i>Jaye</i>): Received training on reactive attachment disorder (RAD). They would like to do a conference on gender base differences in the Spring. The staff has been asking for training on autism. In working with reactive attachment disorder, it was found that the children do better if taken out of the classroom setting. This is taking a lot</p>	

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	<p>more time but they have seen success with this approach.</p> <p><b>Public Health Dept</b> (<i>Char</i>): Linda Pipgras will be attending future meetings to take minutes.</p> <p><b>Human Service Center</b> (<i>Donna</i>): 2 case managers have been hired: Bridget from Impact Counseling and Michelle from Koinonia. The clerical supervisor position is still open. Donna and Tamara are currently doing day-to-day and management duties. Looking at leasing Koinonia to another agency. Currently have 12 children and 5 adults in wrap around services.</p> <p><b>Fredrick Place</b> (<i>Tammy</i>): Observed National Hunger-Homelessness Week with event at YMCA. Currently have 12 residents. 85 residents have stayed at Fredrick Place and 125 had to be turned away, either because of lack of available beds or because they didn't meet the criteria. Community support has been great. Evening meals, donated by businesses, groups, churches and families, are full for the remainder of the year and are 50% complete for 2012.</p> <p><b>Riverside Office</b> (<i>Meredith</i>): As a new member of the CST group, Meredith Holbrook brings experience with wrap arounds in Milwaukee.</p>

Training Opportunities	<p><b>Summary of Child Abuse Training:</b> Mary Gadzalinski was on panel. She reported the information given by the doctors was well received. There still is a misconception on physical abuse and how to report it.</p> <p><b>Summary of CST Training:</b> Jaye Bessa reported the staff had a lot of questions but response to training was positive.</p> <p><b>Other Training Opportunities:</b> Dottie discussed Motivational Interviewing. It is considered an evidence-based program using open-ended questions to lead people to talk. Scott Caldwell, from the State, will do training free of charge if there is enough interest from various agencies. CST could offer at little or no cost to participants and participants would receive training hours.</p>	Group members are to check with their staff to see if there is any interest in Motivational Interviewing.
