Agency Updates	<p><b>Family Resource Connection</b> (<i>Deb Blackstone/Darcey Miller</i>):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discussed Community Response Program serving Langlade, Oneida &amp; Vilas County Social Services and Lac du Flambeau’s Indian Child Welfare. The program works with families who may need some extra help caring for their children. The program’s goal is to connect families to services and support in the community. They have received some referrals outside of Dept of Social Services but do not want to open up to community yet because they won’t be able to handle once they are up and running with Dept of Social Services.</li> <li>• Nurturing parenting classes are being offered beginning in April on Thursdays from 12:00 – 1:00 p.m. at Riverside Clinic, Conference Room #1.</li> <li>• Family team meetings are part of the grant.</li> <li>• Deb told group they are considering offering Motivational Interviewing.</li> <li>• The Committee was asked to be the steering committee for the grant.</li> </ul> <p><b>Birth-to-3</b> (<i>Mary H</i>): They are coordinating with therapists.</p> <p><b>Wisconsin Family Ties</b> (<i>Jackie Baldwin</i>):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Becoming certified peer specialists.</li> <li>• Sponsoring a Family Fun Day at the Waters of Minocqua on Sunday, April 1, 2012 from 9:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. This event is for families who have children with disabilities. Plans are to open a Headstart program in August. Nicolet College is looking to partner with a nonprofit organization.</li> </ul> <p><b>Public Health Dept (Char):</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Health Department is in the process of filling an 80% nurse position.</li> <li>• The Mental Health Summit is scheduled for May 11, 2012 at the Waters in Minocqua. Presenters are lined up and brochures are ready to be printed.</li> <li>• The Mental Health Interagency Council is collaborating more with the AODA Coalition.</li> <li>• Char has <i>Alcohol Screening for Youth</i> brochures available to anyone interested.</li> </ul> <p><b>Department of Social Services (Beth Hoerschler):</b> Beth has taken Tara Vandenberg's position as Social Services Supervisor.</p> <p><b>State of Wisconsin (Gail Chapman):</b> There will be changes in coverage and types of coverage for Badgercare and MA. Adults are still at risk under certain poverty levels but children are safe.</p> <p><b>Marshfield Hospital (Carole Meade):</b> They have a new social worker for children down to age nine.</p> <p><b>Ministry Medical Group (Dr. Paul Wegehaupt):</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A new pediatric/ psychologist has been added to the staff.</li> <li>• Electronic records have created problems. To protect privacy and confidentiality, access is limited. Medical doctors are struggling with receiving information on their own patients.</li> </ul> <p><b>Rhinelander School District (Jaye Bessa):</b></p>	<p><b>Jackie Baldwin will send state Mental Health toolkit to Char.</b></p>
