Agency Updates	<p>Social Services (<i>Mary</i>): Oneida, Marathon, Langlade and Portage counties joined together to form the IM Central Consortium. The Consortium went live on January 1st. In other news, Tara Vandenberg will be retiring January 12th. There are currently two vacancies in Social Services, one in Child Welfare and one in Economic Support. Also, a support staff will be leaving.</p> <p>Rhineland School District (<i>Jaye</i>): They will be posting for a school psychologist.</p> <p>Headwaters (<i>Maureen</i>): Birth-to-3 will be switching to a coaching model.</p> <p>County Board (<i>John Hoffman</i>): John will be retiring from the County Board. There are a number of County Board members who will not be seeking re-election.</p> <p>UW-Extension (<i>Erica</i>): Erica is the Family Living Agent with UW-Extension and is new to the group. She gave an overview of her department. A poverty simulation was done in November and was well received. Lincoln County will present a similar simulation January 14th at the Roadway Inn in Tomahawk. A miniature simulation will be introduced to leadership personnel January 12th, using the Consortium Call Center as part of their exercise. In January, the Extension office will be performing a head count of the homeless in both Rhineland and Minocqua. A class called “Raising a Thinking Child” was done at the YMCA in November. <p>Program Overviews</p>	<p>Emergency Mental Health Crisis Services: Forest, Vilas and Oneida counties along with 12 other counties are receiving a grant from the state for \$100,000. There is a need for money for crisis lines 24/7, staffed by mental health specialists. RFP went to Green Bay, Family Services. There is more than one crisis number for the state. Counties that had a crisis line kept their phone numbers. The Northern Regional Crisis Center got 3,172 calls for ¾ of the year. 56% of those calls were from Vilas, Oneida and Forest counties. The counties use to pay for all of the cost, now they will only pay a portion and the state grant will pick up the balance. The crisis</p>

	<p>line is available for therapists to do wellness checks and has a list of all screeners for use by law enforcement personnel, if needed.</p> <p>The second part of the grant will go towards mobile crisis. The purpose is to divert people from hospitalization that do not need to be hospitalized. This is where screeners come in. An additional option we have is stabilization centers. We have crisis beds at Koinonia that can be monitored. By diverting to crisis beds and stabilization centers, we have saved \$250,000 from January – June for Oneida, Vilas and Forest counties alone. The push next year is: What do we do with the children? In the past, we could not use crisis beds.</p> <p>Part of the grant dollars will also go to training. A survey went out this year, but no response back yet.</p>
