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<p>Dr. Paul Wegehaupt's Parting message to the Committee</p>	<p><u>Paul Wegehaupt, M.D., pediatrician</u>: Not enough psychologists to assess children, make diagnosis, and if medications are indicated, have provisions in place to give a prescription. It has been a risky presumption that pediatricians provide psychiatry and mental health needs. They do try to meet those needs, but their practice has changed, and it has become very stressful. Pediatricians are asked to cover every aspect, from providing oral hygiene/tooth decay education to being early education advocates for reading, etc. Additionally, access to records is daunting. Analyzing complex children and needing information from multiple agencies is not adequate, time-consuming, and no end in sight. Basically, the need is great for more psychiatrists!</p> <p>Jackie of WI Family Ties expressed that this is a nationwide problem, a lack of child psychiatrists. She reports that physicians are frustrated and extremely stressed, as well as not reimbursed for these services.</p> <p>Gail of AHEC inquired as the best way to reach out, make contact regarding this issue--</p> <p>There is a professional organization of Pediatricians: WI Chapter of AAP, Kia LaBracke (sp?) via internet, and Children's Hospital of WI, Community Mental Health: Dr. Jay O'Brady (or O'Grady). *</p> <p>*I may not have truly captured the essence of Dr. Wegehaupt's fervent plea and description of a pediatrician's conscientious stand for the appropriate treatment of children and families requiring mental health services that may be beyond the capacity of the family's pediatrician. We wish Dr. Wegehaupt all the best in his future endeavors, and applaud his speaking out on this topic.
