Issues and Concerns		
Legislative/ Funding Updates	<p>Gail spoke about state grant RFP: regionalization on Mental Health and Substance Abuse. Human Service Center could apply. Schools are missed in distribution.</p> <p>Donna discussed the crisis center and its inability to detain dementia patients. They are working with Social Services and Law Enforcement. Currently, no mental unit or nursing home can take them so they are stuck with placement at Mendota.</p> <p>Brian discussed Helen E. F. who was detained under Wisconsin’s involuntary commitment law, known as Chapter 51. Chapter 51 allows someone with a mental illness, drug dependency or developmental disability to be detained on an emergency basis if they could harm themselves or others. The case argues that Alzheimer’s or dementia is not considered a qualifying mental condition for purposes of Chapter. 51commitment. The disease is a degenerative brain disorder, which is by definition excluded from Chapter 51 but included within Chapter 55 (protective placement). Moreover, the disease is not treatable.</p>	<p>Gail will send information to Jaye when it comes out.</p> <p>Brian will bring back more information to the next meeting on the Helen E.F. dementia case.</p>

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	Donna also discussed Chapter 48 in regards to out of home placement and kids in crisis. Crisis beds for children involve more work. Discussed training parent advocates. Need to change dynamics until parent cools off. Either stay with family until parent cools off or get the child out of the environment. Need to evaluate if it's good for the child to go back into setting.
