Legislative/ Funding Updates	<p>Background copied here for reference from last meeting:          Donna discussed crisis services and the inability to detain dementia patients. They are working with Social Services and Law Enforcement. Currently, no mental unit or nursing home can take them so they are stuck with placement at Mendota. <i>(please refer to Andrea’s update re: Ministry, above).</i></p> <p>Brian discussed Helen E. F. who was detained under Wisconsin’s involuntary commitment law, known as Chapter 51. Chapter 51 allows someone with a mental illness, drug dependency or developmental disability to be detained on an emergency basis if they could harm themselves or others. The case argues that Alzheimer’s or dementia is not considered a qualifying mental condition for purposes of Chapter 51 commitment. The disease is a degenerative brain disorder, which is by definition excluded from Chapter 51 but included within Chapter 55 (protective placement). Moreover, the disease is not treatable.</p> <p>Additional information per Brian 9/4/12: There are no local placement options for</p>	

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	<p>this level of care and funding is needed. Recall that Chapter 51 is for emergent placement services (involuntary/mental commitment) and Chapter 55 is for Adult Protective Services. According to the Supreme Court, if there is a primary diagnosis of dementia, a person can't be committed and qualify under Chapter 51 as a mental illness. Note that a person could start under 51 and go to Chp. 55, but cannot go in the reverse.</p>
