Mission

Goal

Increase the exclusivity, incidence, and duration of breastfeeding in Oneida, Forest, Vilas and Price counties in accordance with the <u>U. S. Healthy People 2020 Breastfeeding Maternal & Child Health Objectives</u>, <u>Healthiest Wisconsin 2020</u>, and in collaboration with local Community Health Improvement Plans.
