<p>New VFC Vaccine Waste Policy</p>	<p>Jane shared the <b>DRAFT</b> information regarding the new VFC waste policy.</p> <p>Summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Clinics will need to be more accountable</li> <li>-Clinics will “payback” after reaching a 5% loss in VFC vaccine waste</li> <li>-The vaccine payback is clinic private purchase to VFC, not in money.</li> <li>-May start July 1<sup>st</sup></li> <li>-Exceptions are in place for disasters such as floods, storms, power outages, multi-dose vials and flu</li> <li>-clinics will need to show proof of 3 attempts to transfer outdated vaccine 3months prior expiration date.</li> </ul>	<p>Email Jane with specific questions. <a href="mailto:jane.Dunbar@dhs.wisconsin.gov">jane.Dunbar@dhs.wisconsin.gov</a></p>
<p>Tdap recommendation for Pregnant women</p>	<p>Summary:</p> <p><u>ACIP</u> Health-care personnel should <b>administer a dose of Tdap during each pregnancy</b> irrespective of the patient’s prior history of receiving Tdap. <p>Resources: CDC Immunization Webcasts, Schedules for 2013, Changes with VIS sheets</p>	<p><b>Simplified VISs.</b> As VISs are updated, they will appear in a slightly simpler format, and will generally be less specific in certain areas (for example, schedules). The idea is to make them more easily understandable by including only information most likely to be useful at the time of vaccination (and that which is required by law). The format will also be consistent for all vaccines.
