He stated that they will now be able to do the 2 take back events this year. One in May and one in September. The legislation went through and the waste will be taken to a site in Indiana.</p> <p>2.) KNOW Project is now working with MHLT as well as JWMS. The information on KNOW went out in the Hodag Pride E-Letter. Lynn requested funding from the Federal Human Service RX grant for KNOW workbooks. Cooper requested that she e-mail him with how much money they would need, what specifically for and how many needed.</p> <p>3.) Karen Knudson reported on the Mental Health Coalition. They have elected a new chair; Laura Rozga -Vilas County. Next year their plan includes QPR-suicide prevention training in the schools to staff. Katie Kennedy reported on the Suicide Prevention Walk. The walk is on hold. They are considering working with the Walk Out of the Darkness or working with Ministry. NAMI is now in a new location, South Park School, Katie is asking for a brochure with the new address on it. Dawn Klink distributed a copy of the grant deliverables for AODA Coalition members to review. Reported that we achieved the first 2 deliverables listed. Karen requested a copy of the grant deliverables and to be updated with dates and times of webinars and summits. The grant will award up to \$2,000.00 per funded-partner community for the entire funding period: January 1, 2015 go December 31, 2016. The purpose of the grant is to support long-term, consistent engagement in its Community of Practice and the completion of “deliverables” to evaluate it, CHIA will provide expert facilitated training, technical assistance, and complimentary registration to the project’s two statewide summits for up to four participants per site. See copy of attached Grant Deliverables.</p> <p>3.) Cooper Henckel administrator of the Human Services Federal Grant was able to attend today’s meeting electronically. Cooper stated that the <i>Rise Together</i> presentation presented at James Williams Middle School on February 18, 2015 was a success. The presentation was also done in Forest County and they had a total of 1,400 students who saw the presentations. It was brought up that support groups are needed for overdose. Lynn asked to be included if <i>Rise Together</i> presents at the High School. Karen asked if parents were included in the presentation. Cooper reported that <10 were included. He also reported that Kiwanis brought a group to present. It was felt that what is missing is a space for kids to cope/share openly. Susan Hampton commented that Counselors are <i>not</i> AODA specialists. Katie stated that Options is licensed to see kids in schools and could help with this. Lynn suggested school wide coping needed. Prevention could be a part of the Diversity Club and the Change Group.</p> <p>4.) Lynn reported that Three Lakes and Lakeland can put a message on Key Rings to promote the AODA coalition. She would like coalition members to think of what they would like that message to be and to let her know their ideas.</p>
